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## City of Toronto Paves the Way for a Thriving Night Economy

Toronto, Today, The City of Toronto took bold steps to enhance its nighttime economy, recognizing its crucial role in cultural vitality, livability, and economic prosperity. With the adoption of the Toronto Nightlife Action Plan, various City divisions and agencies have collaborated to strike a balance between fostering creativity and commerce and addressing public health and order concerns in a densely populated city.

Close collaboration between divisions has resulted in reports informed by harm reduction work at Toronto Public Health and efforts for safer streets and communities under the SafeTO initiative.

Economic Development and Culture, alongside Municipal Licensing and Standards and City Planning, is leading enhancements to provide flexibility for restaurant operators, aligning with market trends and consumer expectations. These changes aim to support revenue generation in a sector where less than half of operators currently operate at a profit, while ensuring compliance with zoning requirements.

Recognizing nightclubs as integral to the night economy, the proposed zoning limits are robust, addressing size, height, residential proximity, and setbacks. A modern licensing regime complements zoning changes to ensure responsible business operations and positive community engagement.

Contrary to concerns, the proposed zoning limits on nightclubs are stringent, with clear provisions to prevent any adverse impact on retail communities. Instead, the city anticipates the emergence of new nightclubs contributing to a diverse and vibrant mix of businesses in local communities.

This proposal represents an excellent opportunity to leverage zoning and licensing powers to create a harmonious system. The proposed zoning changes aim to reduce red tape, protect against conflicts, and establish clear rules for businesses and residents alike.
