Upcoming Sewer Rehabilitation Work In Your Area

Construction Area: Kingston Road from 4384 Kingston Road to Lawrence Avenue East

Construction Window: JAN. 22 - FEB. 16, 2018






Time on the Street: 1 - 5 Days




You are receiving this notice because you may be impacted by the upcoming sewer main rehabilitation activities on the above noted street. This project is part of the Council-approved Capital Works Program to renew our aging infrastructure, reduce the risk of leaks, and ensure continued long-term reliable sewer service.

WORK DETAILS

The rehabilitation of the nearby sewer main involves flushing the sewer with high pressure water to remove any debris and installing a structural liner which will adhere to the existing pipe to form a new pipe wall. Access to the sewer is made through maintenance holes on the street; in most cases, excavation is not required.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

	<p>Overnight Work Hours:</p> <p>In an effort to minimize traffic disruption and congestion, work will take place from 7:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., Monday to Friday. Please note that work may extend beyond this window in special circumstances (e.g. access issues, heavy calcite buildup within pipe, etc.).</p> <p>Note: Work will not take place on statutory holidays.</p>
	<p>Service Disruptions: There will be <u>no disruptions</u> to your water or sewer services.</p>
	<p>Construction Noise: You may experience intermittent noise and vibration during construction (from vacuum trucks, power generators, air compressors, etc.). All work will comply with the City of Toronto's Noise Bylaw.</p>
	<p>Odour: You may experience short-term odours while the sewer is being flushed and re-lined.</p> <p>Drain pipes are designed to retain water after use to help create a barrier that prevents odour from entering your home (see illustration to the right).</p> 

	<p>IMPORTANT: It is highly recommended that you pour at least one litre of water down every drain (i.e. sinks, showers, bathtub, floor drains). Throughout the duration of construction window, additional water may need to be added to ensure this barrier is present.</p> <p>If any type of strong odour is present in your home due to a dry drain or private plumbing issues, please call the contact the Field Ambassador noted at the bottom of this Notice for assistance.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users may experience delays as a result of increased traffic on nearby main and side streets if temporary road closures or lane reductions in the work area are required to complete the work safely.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p> <p>You may park outside of the inspection work zone. City Parking Officers will be advised not to issue tickets for “Parking in Excess of Three Hours” on affected streets. Tickets will be issued for all other violations, such as parking too close to a corner or fire hydrant and other restricted areas.</p>
